

### Expressive Arts and Design in the Early Years

Art is embedded within the Early Years' Foundation Stage Curriculum through the use of the learning environment and classroom provision. Teachers in the Early Years plan topics and experiences to cover the breadth of the curriculum, but also follow the children's interests, which can often take them in a different direction.

Early Years aim to provide opportunities and experiences which enable children to develop the following fundamental skills that lay the foundations of the primary art curriculum:

- Build dexterity skills
- Explore materials and mark making in a playful way
- Use bodies and imaginations to inspire making
- Explore how they can reflect and share their views about what they have seen or made
- Explore how art enriches our lives

Art and Design in Key Stage One and Two is taught in half termly units of work throughout the primary phase. On our Subject Long Term Plan, learning is presented in a consistent manner as detailed below:
