Growth and Change

Reception-Mckee Summer Term 2024



Literacy

As readers, we will continue to apply our phonics knowledge to read words and to identify and blend known 'best friends' (digraphs and trigraphs) to read more complex words. We will learn to recognise and read a range of red words with greater confidence and speed.

As writers, we will use the sounds we know to segment and spell words accurately, or in a way that is phonetically plausible, and we will spell red words correctly when working in a guided group or independently. We will be challenged to write for different purposes during our independently led activities.

As mathematicians, we will be exploring numbers beyond 10, counting up to and back from 20 and calculating what 1 more and 1 less than a given number up to 20 is. We will consolidate our addition knowledge by combining different amounts and record what we have found out independently. We will also be supported to write an equation.

We will explore the passing of time, using time related language to talk about changes we have experienced. We will measure plants as they grow and compare two measurements.

As communicators, we will be sharing our work with others developing our listening and turn taking skills. We will be supported to respond to what we have herd by asking relevant questions. We will be encouraged to undertake various tasks around the class room whilst we talk with others, remembering our class rules for speaking and

As physically active people, we will hold a pencil or pen using a tripod grip when writing and form the majority of letters correctly ensuring they are of similar size and formed on the line. We will continue to find safe and varied ways to travel, for example: moving around, over or through. We will think about how to make healthy choices and
